

#### Lost WWII Catalina positively identified

The Royal Australian Air Force has completed a search and recovery mission in Indonesia for 10 Australian airmen aboard Catalina A24-50, 76 years after the aircraft failed to return from a wartime mission.

A24-50 was reported missing on 2 September 1943 while on a sea mining operation to Sorong in occupied Dutch New Guinea. The wreckage of the RAAF No 11 Squadron Catalina was located near Fakfak in West Papua in April 2018.

When she went missing, the crew of A24-50 consisted of;

Minister for Veterans and Defence Personnel Darren Chester said the Air Force Unrecovered War Casualties team positively identified the missing aircraft during a reconnaissance mission to the crash site last year. "We are committed to honouring the service and sacrifice of Australian military personnel from all theatres of war," Mr Chester said. "The RAAF team has concluded further search activities in the field and have reported finding a number of items of interest which require further testing in order to confirm the origin of each item.

"The only major recognisable pieces of wreckage were two sections of the wing, engines and propeller, and the empennage (rear part of fuselage) across the top of a ridge. "We are very grateful for the support and assistance provided by the Indonesian Air Force throughout this process, without which this work could not take place."

#### Meritorious Unit Citation – Rwanda

Australian Service Contingents 1 and 2 who served in Rwanda on Operation Tamar were today recognised with the award of a Meritorious Unit Citation.

Operation Tamar was Australia's contribution to the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda, which consisted of sending approximately 700 Australian Defence Force personnel in two contingents to provide medical support and security for the medics.

Minister for Veterans and Defence Personnel Darren Chester said that from 1994 to 1996 it was estimated that more than 800,000 innocent civilians were killed in Rwanda by armed militias and trained military forces, attracting world-wide attention and condemnation. "The men and women of Australian Service Contingents 1 and 2 demonstrated extraordinary courage, discipline and compassion in the performance of their duties and on behalf of their country we recognise their meritorious service," Mr Chester said.

General David Hurley, Governor-General of Australia, gazetted the award of the Meritorious Unit Citation today, on the 25th Anniversary of Australian Service Contingent 1 arriving in Rwanda.

To be eligible to wear the citation insignia with the Federation Star, members must have completed 30 days service on Operation Tamar between 25 July 1994 and 8 March 1996.

(Veterans who believe they are eligible are encouraged to apply directly to the Department of Defence, through the Defence Medals.)

### **Everyman's Welfare Service**

On Friday the 23<sup>rd</sup> August, members were given an introduction into the **Everyman's Welfare Service** by *Representative Jeff Greene*, from the Land Warfare Centre, Kokoda Barracks in Canungra, to Everyman's and the benefit they provide to the ADF.

Jeff travelled up to Warwick and brought with him a new 'Brew Truck,' most older veterans would remember the old Army jeep and strapped on the back was a hot box, with hot chocolate or cold drinks, biscuits and sweets (lollies). Jeff gave a talk and a visual display on the work EWS does in and around the bases, with both current and ex-members ADF members and their families.

While they are not members of the ADF, the Everyman's Representatives receive ADF accreditation and hold honorary officer status. They work from Recreation Centres on Bases and travel with the troops on Military Exercises and operational deployments. They are issued with military clothing, but not with weapons. They are a trans-denominational Christian Charity, serving on behalf of all Australian Christian churches, once commissioned into the work the staff undergo an initial 12-month on-the-job training program, that ensures they are qualified to handle any situation within the military structure.


Their greatest benefit to the Defence Force is the time and genuine care that they can give to the troops, the Everyman's Welfare Representative can stop, get to know the person, build a relationship and be available in times of requirement and all remains totally confidential.

EWS are a non-Government funded, Not for Profit Charity and all donations over \$ 2.00 are Tax deductible.

Everyman's provides club and recreational facilities through "Everyman's Centres" on Military Bases for service personnel, the centre is a place to come and relax with mates or to find the sympathetic ear of the Everyman's Representative, it's a place of encouragement and fellowship and a "Home away from Home"! They provide amenities such as computer games, pool tables, board games and play stations at no-charge, as well as other amenities like videos & DVD's and Internet facilities.

In the field, Everyman's Representatives turn up with their "Brew Trucks" in the most unexpected places, often at the most unexpected times. They provide hot or cold drinks, something to eat, reading materials, letter writing facilities, a word of encouragement.



## Bulimba Barracks <u>'SOLD'</u> to Taiwanese-back developer


Defence has entered into a contract with Shayher Group for the sale of the decommissioned Bulimba Barracks site on the Brisbane River, the sale of the 20-hectare site marked a significant step in the government's commitment to unlocking surplus Commonwealth land for alternative uses, including housing. Shayher Group is an Australian developer [with Taiwanese backing, according to other sources] with a record of delivering redevelopments in Brisbane and Melbourne,

The sale of Bulimba Barracks will increase housing supply in Brisbane, with the Brisbane City Council's Bulimba Barracks Master Plan estimating a potential development outcome of about 855 residences, including a range of housing types. The Indigenous and historic heritage values of Bulimba Barracks will continue to be protected following the sale of the property in accordance with the local and state heritage-protection legislation. Defence anticipates settlement of the property in early 2020.





The little boy then went to his mother, asked her the same question and she told him;


"We were monkeys then we evolved to become like we are now."

# **A Lasting Legacy**

In 1969 he was in command of HMAS *Melbourne* (II) when the United States Navy destroyer USS *Frank E Evans* turned under the Australian aircraft carrier's bow and was cut in half. He was subsequently cleared by Court Martial for any responsibility for the tragedy and in 2012 received an official apology from then Defence Minister Stephen Smith for having been tried. The apology letter acknowledged the unnecessary stress the Court Martial caused to Captain Stevenson and his family.

Captain Stevenson was farewelled in January 2019 in the Garden Island Naval Chapel in Sydney with a ceremonial funeral, normally reserved only for officers who pass away during their service at the rank of Captain. This is the first time in the Royal Australian Melbo (Australian Stevenson) Navy's history that a serving Captain's funeral has been held for a retired officer. Chief of Navy, Vice Admiral Mike Noonan, said the ceremonial funeral recognised the very great contribution made by Captain Stevenson in peace and war to the Navy and the nation.

"Captain JP Stevenson has been accorded a ceremonial funeral of a serving Navy Captain to recognise that the circumstances in which he resigned from the Navy were unique, and to ensure there can be no doubt as to the very great esteem in which he is now held across our Navy," Vice Admiral Noonan said. "There can be no doubt that past mistakes were made that impacted both Captain Stevenson and his family. The Navy of 2019 is a more people focused organisation and strives to ensure that similar mistakes are not repeated. "With the passing of Captain Stevenson, our Navy family has lost a fine leader and consummate gentleman, who served Australia with pride in war and peace over a 35-year career and continued to support our Navy long after his time in uniform. "We hope today's formal farewell, in addition to the formal apology Captain Stevenson received from Government in 2012, will help ease the burden which the Stevenson family has had to bear over the past five decades," Vice Admiral Noonan said.

As part of today's sad farewell, Captain Stevenson's coffin was carried into the Garden Island Naval Chapel by six serving junior sailors from HMAS *Melbourne* (III). As the hearse passed through Fleet Base East, *Melbourne*'s ship's company lined the rails of the warship as a mark of respect, while wharf sentries from other ships saluted. Captain Stevenson was also given a seven-gun salute, which is normally reserved for serving officers who die while in command of a ship or shore establishment. A unique and remarkable career

Captain Stevenson entered the Royal Australian Naval College (which was then at HMAS *Cerberus*) as a 13-year-old Cadet Midshipman in 1934. As a junior officer, he saw war service in HMA Ships *Canberra*, *Nestor*, *Napier* and *Shropshire*. He was present in Yokohama Bay for the Japanese surrender in 1945 and witnessed the results of the atomic bomb dropped on Nagasaki. He was engaged in getting many sick and malnourished prisoners of war embarked for their return to Australia.

After the war, Lieutenant Stevenson went to the United Kingdom on loan to the Royal Navy where he saw operational service in the early days of the Malayan Emergency. Promoted to Lieutenant Commander in 1950 he returned to Australia in the aircraft carrier HMAS *Sydney* (III). Upon arrival in Australia he took command, in March 1951, of the frigate HMAS *Barcoo* which operated as the Royal Australian Navy's training ship. He later served in the heavy cruiser HMAS *Australia* (II) as navigation officer, and later re-joined Sydney as the Fleet Navigation Officer.

Sydney visited the United Kingdom for the coronation of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II where Stevenson commanded the Royal Australian Navy detachment during the coronation parade. In 1954 Commander Stevenson was Director of Plans in Navy Office and served in HMY *Britannia* as the naval equerry to His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh during the Royal visit to the 1956 Olympic Games in Melbourne. He commanded the destroyer HMAS *Anzac* (II) from January 1957 to June 1958 and in May 1959 was appointed as the Defence attaché to Thailand, where he was promoted to Captain in December 1960. Captain Stevenson assumed command of HMAS *Watson*, in October 1961, and the following October took command of the destroyer HMAS *Vendetta* (II) as well as commanding the 10th Destroyer Squadron.

In April 1964 he commanded the fast troop transport HMAS *Sydney* (III) which took Australian troops to Borneo. In 1965 he commanded HMAS *Cerberus*. Then in late 1966 he became the Australian naval attaché in Washington, DC. After returning to Australia he assumed command of the aircraft carrier HMAS *Melbourne* (II) in October 1968. In the early hours of 3 June 1969 in the South China Sea, the American destroyer USS *Frank E Evans* crossed *Melbourne*'s bow and was cut in two. The forward section of *Evans* sank immediately, resulting in the loss of 74 lives and *Melbourne* sustained extensive damage to her bow. A joint US Navy/Royal Australian Navy Board of Inquiry in Subic Bay held Stevenson partly responsible, stating that as Commanding Officer of *Melbourne* he could have done more to prevent the collision from occurring. However, a subsequent Royal Australian Navy Court Martial cleared him of any responsibility and commended him for his efforts to prevent the collision.

The integrity of the initial Board of Inquiry has since been questioned, particularly as it was presided over by the US Navy Admiral in overall tactical command of *Evans* at the time of the collision. Stevenson's defence counsel at his Navy Court Martial, Gordon Samuels, QC, stated he had "never seen a prosecution case so bereft of any possible proof of guilt." Despite being cleared, Captain Stevenson subsequently resigned from the Royal Australian Navy - bringing his distinguished 35-year naval career to an end.

In December 2012, Stevenson received an official apology from the Minister for Defence, the Honourable Stephen Smith, MP, in which the Minister stated that Stevenson was not treated fairly by the government of the day and the Royal Australian Navy following the events of 1969. Minister Smith described Stevenson as "a distinguished naval officer who served his country with honour in peace and war." Following a successful civilian career, John Stevenson continued to work with service charities and was appointed as a Member of the Order of Australia (AM) in the 2018 Australia Day Honours List. Despite being cleared, Captain Stevenson subsequently resigned from the Royal Australian Navy - bringing his distinguished 35-year naval career to an end.

### Pension increase from 20 September 2019.

Pension recipients including veterans, their partners, war widows and widowers across Australia will see the increase from **20 September 2019.** 



Due to the calculation of pension rates on a daily basis, the first pension paid after the indexation on payday **26 September 2019** will comprise a component of both the old and new rates.

Department of Veterans' Affairs

The new pension rates will be fully effective from pension day **10 October 2019.**


