- 1. That all property, assets and finances, be transferred from VSASA Warwick Auspice, to the Southern Downs Ex-Services Association Queensland Incorporated, with effect from the 1st July 2018.
- 2. That all current financial members of VSASA Warwick Auspice for the year 2018/2019, will be invited to become members of the Southern Downs Ex-Services Association Queensland Incorporated, without having to fill out new application forms, or unless otherwise directed by the member.

This is an important meeting, as it will be the last meeting of the 'VSASA Warwick Auspice'. As from the 1st July 2018, VSASA Warwick Auspice will be known as the 'Southern Downs Ex-Services' Association Queensland Incorporated'.

VSASA Constitution states; 28. WINDING-UP / DISSOLUTION:

If upon winding-up or dissolution of the Association, there remains after satisfaction of all its debts and liabilities, any property whatsoever, the same shall not be paid to or distributed amongst the members of the Association, but shall be given or transferred to some other institution or institutions having objects similar to the objects of the Association, gifts to which are allowable deductions under the provisions of section 78 (4) and (5) of the Income Tax Assessment Act, and which shall prohibit the distribution of its or their income or property amongst its or their members, and which is a fund, authority or institution approved by the Commissioner of taxation as a fund, authority or institution referred to in section 78 of the Income Tax Assessment Act, such institution or, institutions to be determined by the members of the Association.

A PADRE'S TALE...



Chaplain Campbell Carroll returns from Active Service in the Middle East.

Well, I'm back at work now, and it's good to be back somewhere familiar, though it isn't going to last long because I'm off on Posting to RAAF Townsville in a few weeks. It feels strange to leave a place that I very much call home, but that's typical of military life isn't it...

Given the last three years that I've been here, I find myself reflecting on the things I've done - and it's a lot!

I've only recently returned from Active Service in the Middle East. I had promised myself, beforehand, I would do some professional development reading. As a Defence Chaplain I find that by the time I get home, the last thing I want to do is professional reading. - But not this time; I had taken with me three books I very much wanted to read. Given that I was in the desert, I figured the environment would create a 'feeling' for the promised reading.

The first book was about Nicky Barr; I couldn't put it down. I was captivated. The second was about Clive Caldwell, again I just couldn't put it down. The third was another about the Desert War in general and it just seemed to put a completely different perspective on what took place there. It enabled me to gain a very deep appreciation and pride to be part of our Squadron's impressive and extraordinary history.



Even when it got difficult (and at times it did...) I was often reminded that for the Three Padres - and both Clive and Nicky - it was 'their own people', the people they led or cared for, that came first. This same ethic was why I was here in the Middle East in the first place. It was a very real privilege to serve our people in those places.

Coming home was interesting. Going to War changes you, it's not until you come home you realise this fact. I took some time off, but I couldn't really wait to get back to work. I missed the Squadron - especially the noise and the dramas!

Once again, it was back to Richmond for the pre-ANZAC Day Service and the pride of my working career was marching in Sydney with the Squadron and the last of our WW2 Veterans. I thought at one point that the Three Padres were there, marching alongside. A Padre rarely gets to march, and this was a day I was going to remember for the rest of my life. Our CO granted me a passenger ride in an FA18 and the Pilot was DEVO - someone I admire greatly. I couldn't believe it! - If only "The Three Padres" could have seen it! Yep, I'm back at work, but I'm sad I'm leaving a Squadron that I feel extremely proud of. They have always been there both at the highs and the lows.

I think my heart will always belong to 3SQN. It's odd, but there is something about having been a part of something so unique. It's more than a fighter squadron - it's family.

'Cyber-Bullying'



There are some members of our community who use social media to bully others. When I use the term '*bullying*' I am referring to the definition from the Australian Government

Human Rights website: "Bullying is when people repeatedly and intentionally use words or actions against someone or a group of people to cause distress and risk to their well-being."

While the majority of people who use social media do not contribute to this sort of behaviour, there are a small number who do, and I believe they are having a negative effect on our community. These people believe they can write whatever they want about other people. They do this repeatedly and their intention is to cause distress to the person they are targeting.

The problem is the people who take this action, particularly on Facebook, don't think they are doing anything wrong. I am not talking here about children or teenagers. I am talking about adults: parents and grandparents who are deliberately engaging in cyber-bullying.

I believe it is time to take a stand and I can only use myself as an example. Over the last two years I have been a target of cyber-bullying by a small number of individuals: on a daily, weekly and monthly basis. They have persistently attacked me by making statements that are cruel and meant to hurt. I have ignored these **people and their bullying behaviour because what they say doesn't affect** me or influence the decisions I make.

However, I have come to the conclusion that by ignoring their actions I am sending a message that it is acceptable for them to behave in this manner. This cyber-bullying if left unchecked, makes everyone feel as if they are powerless. Observers see nothing is done to stop these cyber-bullies and it has a cumulative effect: each person fears being the first to contradict them or call them out, lest he or she become their next target. This means each individual is being forced to live in fear. Every person has a right to be treated fairly and with respect. Every person has a right to feel safe when they go online and not to dread being confronted with hate statements posted there by bullies.

Over recent weeks I've looked more closely at what these people post on Facebook, not just about me but about other people as well. These people do not see themselves as bullies. They believe they are just

expressing their opinions. But when they do that repeatedly and with the cruel intention to cause distress and harm to others; then they are bullies.

I anticipate that by me bringing attention to their actions, these bullies will become harsher in their attacks on me personally. Let them do so. Their bullying behaviour will be even more evident. By speaking out it is my goal to bring the behaviour of these people to public notice and to bring awareness to these people themselves that they are accountable, now and forever, for what they post on social media.

\$100 million to enhance Army Artillery

Soldiers from Townsville-based 4th Regiment fire an M777 155mm Howitzer in High Range Training Area.

Queensland company NIOA has been awarded a \$100 million contract to supply 155mm M777 Lightweight Towed Howitzer ammunition to the Army. Minister

for Defence Industry Christopher Pyne said this ammunition would replace an ageing ammunition stock, providing increased range and lethality, as well as a greater range of effects, such as infrared illumination to enhance the Army's advanced night-fighting capability.

"This is an exciting new market for Australian defence industry and we hope after successful qualification of the ammunition, industry can start making the training rounds locally," Mr Pyne said.

"NIOA is also looking at additional opportunities for domestic manufacture of other types of 155mm ammunition.

"This follows my announcement in November last year where I congratulated NIOA on winning a separate contract worth \$95 million to supply more than 30 different munitions over the next five years to the military."

Established in 1973, NIOA is Australia's largest privately-owned company supplying weapons, ammunition and technical support to commercial, military and law-enforcement markets.

Minister Pyne said NIOA's partnership with Rheinmetall Defence, their subsidiaries and Junghans Microtec, demonstrated the innovative approaches embraced by Australian companies to ensure our military is equipped with the best capabilities in the world.

"Up to 22 new jobs will be created to acquire the modern high-performance 155mm ammunition.

"The contract will create 12 new jobs at NIOA for the next two years while the ammunition is qualified and then, subject to a successful business case, NIOA estimates employing up to 10 more people in the domestic assembly of training ammunition."
