

Ex-HMAS Tobruk scuttled

Ex-HMAS Tobruk was towed out of the Port of Bundaberg on Thursday 28 June 2018 in preparation for her final scuttling on Friday 30 June 2018.

The ship, which was built in Newcastle, NSW, in 1979/80, was commissioned into the Royal Australian Navy in April 1981 and decommissioned in July 2015.

The scuttling of the ex-HMAS Tobruk is a project partnership between the Queensland government and the Bundaberg and Fraser Coast Regional Councils to create an artificial reef and dive site in Hervey Bay. She served with Battle Honours in East Timor 1999. HMAS Tobruk was commissioned on the 23rd April 1981, was a Landing Ship Heavy (LSH) with a pennant of L50. Her motto was *'Faithful and Strong'* and with a 5800-ton displacement was an excellent support for Amphibious Operations (ranging from the Squirrel AS350-B to Chinook CH47. She was decommissioned on the 31st July 2015.

Type 26 wins \$35-billion Oz frigate tender

Australia has chosen BAE Systems' Hunter-class frigate as the winning contender in Project SEA 5000 Phase 1 – 'Future Frigate'.

SEA 5000 Phase 1 (Future Frigate) will introduce into service the next generation of naval surface combatants



at an estimated cost of more than \$35 billion for acquisition.

SEA 5000 Phase 1 will replace Australia's existing fleet of eight Anzac-class frigates with a new fleet of nine anti-submarine-warfare frigates.


The first batch of three will be named **HMA Ships Flinders (II)** (SA region named for explorer Captain Matthew Flinders – first circumnavigation of Australia and identified it as a continent); **Hunter** (NSW region named for Vice-Admiral John Hunter – first fleet Captain and 2nd Governor of NSW); and **Tasman** (state and sea named for explorer Abel Tasman – first known European explorer to reach Tasmania, New Zealand and Fiji).


Hunter-class will conduct a variety of missions and have sufficient range and endurance to operate effectively throughout our region.

They will be equipped with a range of offensive and self-protection systems and incorporate the Australian-developed CEA Phased-Array Radar.

In today's announcement, BAE Systems has been named as preferred tenderer with ASC Shipbuilding doing the bulk of the build, at the Osborne Naval Shipyard, South Australia.

This \$35 billion program will create an estimated 4000 Australian jobs around the country.


